Five to Thrive TALK 'The more you talk to me the more I can make sounds into words...... Everything I learn in my life will be built on what you are teaching me now.'

Five to Thrive—TALK

Your child's body grows better when you give the child good food. Your child's brain grows better when you do five simple things that feed the growing brain:

RESPOND CUDDLE RELAX PLAY TALK

Talk to your baby: I love the sound of your voice, don't shout it scares me; sing and talk and read to me instead. Don't worry that I can't talk back yet I am learning how to through listening to you.

Talk to your toddler: Talk to me, listen to me, read to me. I need lots of practice to learn to

communicate. The more I practice the more my brain gets organised and I can learn to express myself.

Five to Thrive is delivered in our baby groups at St Pauls and Hampton House.
