Here at St Pauls we are very proud of the work that we do to support the local community. We reach out and use a creative approach to engage with members of our locality and our families who work alongside one another at wellbeing arts. Wellbeing arts is a relaxed and friendly group art session, the sessions are beneficial for those who are socially isolated, anxious, stressed or suffering from chronic illness. Participants attend for 16 weeks and this term we have enjoyed batik, printmaking, working with clay and sculpture.

We were also invited to participate in an exhibition at City Hall. The 'Culture, Health and Wellbeing Interna-


