♦ The Children's Kitchen

Children's kitchen is providing children with the opportunities to explore, cut, taste and cook with fresh local produce and ingredients. The children are also thinking about healthy eating and how things grow. We will soon start planting vegetables with them. An award winning chef Jo Ingleby has been supporting the team to be more confident with cooking and the smell that comes up the corridor from our kitchen is delicious!

We have now some wonderful new instruments at Nursery and are seeing the children express their musicality everywhere. The staff are so attuned to the music happening in play thanks to all the learning we have been doing with our partners Soundwaves.

Come and join our FOOD CLUB

We are very excited to be able to announce that our Food Club initiated by Central Bristol Children's Centre is now running. Meetings are happening every Wednesday, from 9:30 am – 11:30 am.

This is a weekly club which provides local families with young children a range of affordable food. Families can gain an annual membership for £1 and then be able to purchase a selection of groceries worth £10-£15 for just £3.50 per week. Alongside the Food Club, we will also be providing healthy eating, money budgeting and cookery courses along with weekly cookery demonstrations.

Bookings are not essential, however please give us a call on 0117 903 0337 and ask to speak to Yvonne who will let you know if you are eligible to apply.

NURSERY APPLICATION

If your child was born between **1st January 2017 and 31st August 2017** you need to apply for nursery space for September 2020 by filling in the form available at the reception. Children who are currently in 2-3's room are also required to fill the form in.

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Early Years 1&2

Some of the babies and practitioners have been joining our **Soundwaves sessions** in EY2 with Eliza and Roger our musicians. We have also bought an exciting range of new instruments. The children are showing more confidence in exploring the drums, pitched bells, claves etc. and some are able to join in with the beat and tune into the pitch and pattern of sounds.

Since we have been going, the babies are recalling and joining in with the new songs by noticing the tunes when played on the bells, filling in the missing words and sounds of songs and moving in time with the beat. E.g. "Rain is falling down ... splash". Sometimes they will request a song by beginning to tap their legs.



The practitioners respond to the children's musicality by imitating their sounds and movements and the children often respond with delight as their musical communication has been noticed.

Cooking and the Children's Kitchen - We are enjoying cooking and exploring food in the children's kitchen. Jo and Eliza are supporting us in :

- Learning new skills and trying new flavours
- Learning how to use tools safely
- Baking bread and more ...

As part of our **Soundwaves Project** - we have invested money in beautiful musical instruments, including very big "gathering drums" and lovely-sounding "chime bars".

Soundwaves have been supporting us to develop our understanding of how to support and develop children's musicality, voice and movement.
