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Nursery Update

It's been a busy and exciting last term in Nursery School, as many of the children get ready to move on to the next stage in their learning journeys.. Primary School! There has been so much to celebrate and we are so thankful to share so many memorable experiences with you all. Our trip to Blaise Castle back in May was one of the most memorable it was amazing to see how involved you all got; starting football games, leading walks up to the castle and river, sharing food at lunchtime. We loved hearing from you about the trip - Tameera said that Sayeeda 'loved the openness, and the sense of freedom' at Blaise Castle, 'The river

reminded me of my village in Pakistan,' said Sonia.

Our Garden has been a hive of planting and growing activity this last term especially - the children have been fascinated to observe the life cycle of many vegetables including sweet peas, courgettes, potatoes and runner beans, some of which we dug up and made into samosas and chips for our Eid Party! Delicious! The children have been doing lots of wondering and imagining around their new schools or key groups; we have woven thinking about transition into lots of our learning. One truly amazing example was the journey of our caterpillars, which the children researched, fed and nurtured until it was time to release them as butterflies into our garden. As we said goodbye, we wondered how they felt to be leaving the nursery to go into the big world outside. Learning about the caterpillar life cycle was sparked by lots of

children's strong interest in finding and caring for minibeasts. This led to much research into habitats, diets and life-cycles, even creating our own snail habitats where children could fine-tune their noticing skills to closely study the creatures.

Upcoming transitions have also been supported through ongoing visits to and from our local primary schools. We have watched with delight as your children have proudly shared learning diaries with their new teachers with such ownership. We are noticing the amazing strategies children are using to support themselves through this transition; making links to Nursery by noticing similarities and differences in their new



schools, planning what they may need to take with them - 'all my learning stuff, like my learning diary and my pen,' Ashley tells me.

Alongside goodbyes to many of our children, we are sad to say goodbye this year to some very special Nursery School staff. Eleri, Nawal, Alli and Marco will be leaving us this term, we know they will all be missed greatly by the whole centre. Lastly, we would like to thank you enormously for your ongoing support this year. Our Forest Learning, various trips and parties, in particular our Eid Party, would not be the same without your help - so Thank You for your voices, help and generosity. We have been truly inspired observing your children thrive and achieve throughout this past year, equipping themselves so expertly with skills they will use in their learning at Primary school, and beyond!

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Face Painting and Imaginative Play in Early Years Two



Recently in Early Years Two, the children have been interested in wild animals. Johanna appears to be particularly passionate about big cats and one morning chose to wear the tiger outfit from our role play resources. She then asked Lydia if she could have her face painted like a tiger which then sparked other children's interest in animals. The children were independently choosing how they would like to have their face painted. Salma chose to be a tiger and Iyad chose to be an elephant.

After the children had their faces painted, we noticed the different ways in which they were extending their own play and explorations. Some children became absorbed in imaginative role play where they creatively made links to their animal of choice by imitating what they had experienced these animals to be like.

Jamie and Johanna collaborated when imitating what knowledge they had of tigers and leopards. Johanna found a small, cuddly tiger which she described as "my baby tiger" she began to brush its hair with a comb and kept it close to her throughout the morning. Jamie was really focusing on the way in which leopards move and make sounds. He crept along the floor roaring and





snarling.

As the week has gone on, the interest in face painting and imaginative play has continued and children are using their creativity to think about what they would like to be. After Wen Hao and Mahir had their faces painted like tigers, they both went into the garden and began to "roooooar" and chase each other.

We are all really interested in investigating further how the children are extending their learning in different ways

through having their faces painted. To research this we are changing our reflecting whiteboard

question in order for us to explore this deeper. If there is anything you have noticed at home that may link to imagina-

Supported by Society, weekly drop in to provide support with CV writing, job search and Information and advice and guidance

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
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What have you and your family got planned this summer? Have you thought about visiting these free / cheap days out? Don't forget, under 5s are free on the bus, make up a packed lunch and go on an adventure.....

<u>Brandon Hill (BS1 5RR)</u> features a play area for children, a nature conservation ea and Cabot Tower, from which you can enjoy a beautiful view of Bristol, you can also feed the squirrels so take some nuts!

<u>Ashton Court (BS41 9JN)</u> is a 10 minute drive from the centre of Bristol. It offers cafe, deer park, orienteering and walks through the woods, it also has a miniature rail-way open on selected weekends (see website).

<u>Castle Park (BS1 3XD)</u> is just off the city centre and offers a chance for fresh air ter shopping in the galleries! It has a playground and the remains of a medieval castle enjoy a picnic.





City and Community Farms

The community and city farms around Bristol are mostly free, or ask only for a small donation. They're a nice change from parks, as there are often play areas, as well as a variety of farm animals children can see.

<u>Lawrence Weston Community Farm (BS11 0NJ)</u> This farm is free to enter and is open Tuesday to Sunday between 9.30-4.30. They often run free or affordable events.

St Werburghs

<u>City Farm (BS2 9YJ)</u> This farm is free to enter, with donations welcome, as it's a charity. It's open 7 days a week, from 9am to 5pm in the summer, 9am to 4pm in the winter.

Windmill City Farm (BS3 4EA) This farm is a charity and asks for donations to enter. There are lots of animals to see, a playground for your children to play in, and they also run different activities for children during the school holidays for a small fee.



Bristol Museums

The following museums are offering Holiday Family Fun sessions from 11am—3pm.
