
Head teacher Update

Update—Mealtimes at the Nursery and Childrens Centre

School Meals

Contract caterers Chartwells are being employed from the 12th February, to enable the centre to continue to cook nutritious hot meals from our onsite kitchen with our lovely kitchen staff. The price of the meals will reduce to £1.90 from the 1st March.

To enable Chartwells to be able to prepare menus for children with food allergies/intolerances, forms have been sent to parents that have registered a food allergy or intolerance with the practitioners in each of the rooms. The forms need to be signed by a health professional before they can be actioned and returned to the centre before the 2nd February. If you require a form, please ask at reception.

If for any reason your child will be late and requires a school meal, can you let the office know as meals numbers will need to be submitted by 10am. After this time we are unable to increase the meals numbers.

We can confirm that meals will continue to be halal.

School Dinner Money

Please can you ensure that where possible you provide the correct money when paying for school meals in a named envelope as the office will no longer be able to provide change at busy times of the day including drop off time.

If you require change, please can you make payment and you will be able to collect your change at pick up time.

Envelopes are available at the office. £1 for 50 envelopes

Storing your child's Lunch Box

More and more of our children are having packed lunches and we have been storing these in our Fridge outside Nursery Class 2.

Unfortunately from the 19th February, we will no longer be able to accommodate as due to the large number of lunch boxes

- The number of lunch boxes in the fridge is not allowing the temperature of the fridge to chill to the correct temperature - between 2C-5C
- Storing a large number of lunch boxes together in the fridge increases the risk of contamination of allergens
- Storage of school milk for the children at the correct temperature in a fridge is vital

If your child has food in their Lunch Box that requires refrigeration it is suggested

- Place a freezer block in the freezer overnight and put it in your child's lunch box to bring to Nursery School.
- Use a 'Packit Lunch Box' which can be put in the freezer overnight and can keep food chilled for a few hours

Nursery School Update

Happy New Year to everyone! Firstly, we would like to welcome Lilac Group to Nursery School, who have been gradually settling in Room 2 alongside their keyperson, Faith. It has been wonderful to see lots of new faces making secure transitions from Early Years 2, and from outside of the Centre. We have had a busy and exciting start to 2018, with a real focus on children's Mathematical Development. We have been observing and reflecting upon how children have been exploring mathematical concepts in their play, and responding to their thinking through planning group-times and opportunities in our environment. During group-times we have been finding ways to explore ideas such as 'more' and 'less', 'longer' and 'shorter'. We wonder if you notice any play that explores these concepts at home? A visit from the Bristol Old Vic with their bag of unusual props sparked thinking into things that are really *old*. 'My grandma's really old,' explained Miles, 'because she's got white hair.' We wonder how else we might explore concepts of time and 'oldness'?

Simple provocations in our Studio Space have given children space to explore exploring placing and arranging with loose parts – to amazing effect! Each child has approached with a unique vision – we have seen some intricate patterns and incredible symmetrical designs!

Our visit from the Old Vic, along with our trip to see the show 'Snow Globe,' has inspired much 'performance' role play. Children have been organising each other into audiences and actors, paying for tickets, and deciding upon show times. Each child draws from their unique experiences and they collaborate to create something new.

We maintain our strong links with St Pauls Library – Yellow Group recently attended a Creative Collage session, which saw them persevering and collaborating alongside their families to create a magnificent piece! We will be restarting our Weekly Family Visits to the Library very soon, so please look out for when your child's group is going! **Thankyou as always for all your support.**



Late Fees

We have noticed that some of you are struggling to collect your children on time at the end of sessions.

We know that there can be exceptional circumstances that can make this unavoidable, but it does cause challenges for our staff team as it affects ratios and also many of them are involved in meetings etc beyond the end of the day.

If you would like to adjust your daycare session please speak to Claire –who is always ready to help.

Unfortunately we do have to follow the city council policy on charging for late collection the cost of this is £10 for first late 30mins, after which we would charge the full session cost.

St Paul's Adventure Playground

St Paul's Adventure Playground has been going through lots of changes and is currently being managed by APE Project CIC as part of a Community Asset Transfer. The playground is now completely unfunded and as such the team are looking at ways that the facility can generate income on its own two feet.

The Children's Bike Exchange is based at the playground and operates on Tuesday to Thursday from 10.00am to 6.00pm and offers extremely affordable bikes to children on an exchange basis. It is also possible to buy bikes from them too. All bikes are serviced and safety checked prior to being sold or exchanged. Prices start at £10.00 and cater for all sizes from tiny tricycles to teenage sized bicycles. They also sell and service adult bikes at a very competitive price too. 100% of the proceeds from the Children's Bike Exchange go towards the running of the adventure playground.
