## <u>Head teacher Update</u>

We seem to be heading rather quickly to the end of our school year—yikes! Hopefully we will be blessed with more sun than rain over the next few weeks so we can really make the most of our outdoor area in the summer. It's been quite a year at St Pauls, with so much to celebrate. Most significantly I think, is that we have grown a much enlarged Family Support Team as part of taking on the new role as the Central Bristol Children's Centre Hub, working right across central Bristol with nearly 7000 families!

A huge thankyou needs to go out to Michaela and our Children's Centre team leaders Jenny and Debbie, who have welcomed, supported, learnt from and developed a much bigger and dynamic team to deliver our family support services over a much wider area..... dmiration and respect for them

And what a brilliant team they are already!! I am full of admiration and respect for them. We have also opened our new rooms over at the Family Hub, welcoming children, families and EYs Practitioners to our new training room, family room and Creche. We have also relocated our baby room and enlarged our provision for 2 year olds! We recognise that some of these changes might have felt a bit confusing to you, and have seemed a little bit 'bumpy', at times, but please rest assured we are refocusing on the priority—getting it right for you and your children every single day.

There is plenty more to share with you:

### **Future of Nursery Schools**

As some of you may have seen on the news, Maintained Nursery Schools are facing threat of closure, nationally. We have been waiting for a funding review now for 3 years and it continues to be delayed, or we are given short term temporary reprieves. Our most recent funding is now only guaranteed until summer 2020.

This is a political 'hot potato' as many Nursery Schools are based in highest areas of deprivation across the country. Nursery Schools are some of the few nursery providers that employ teachers to lead on pedagogy and focus on early learning, but we also provide so much more than that. For example our Nursery School here works with at least 50 other nursery providers and schools to support quality improvement. We run training and deliver Teacher Training programmes, we work in and with teams supporting the whole family ,and we support many children with very complex needs.

We have contributed to plenty of reports and papers that have been written about the hidden value of nursery schools and we work in partnership with our other Bristol Nursery Schools and the national Nursery School groups to lobby the government

and share case studies of our effectiveness.

Our outstanding St Pauls Nursery School (the 3-4yr old early education provision) sits in the heart of our integrated service and has huge influence on the quality of our offer to families.

I have no doubt that should the funding vanish for our Nursery School another Early Years provider would fill the gap offering some sort of day-care provision for families and children in St Pauls. But the quality of this, the model, the focus on learning, and the staffing expertise would look very, very different.

Our request nationally is that Nursery Schools receive proper funding to enable us to continue our great work— The evidence of the difference we make and the quality pf the provision we offer is compelling!

This year has seen us working with some great partners in our nursery.

It has involved trips to the Old Vic and We are the Curious, and our Family Support Team getting to know a whole host of other partners with whom they can work to better support our local families— Winston's Wish, Bristol Refugee Rights, Barton Hill Settlement to name just a few.

For next year we are teaming us with a group called **SOUND WAVES**, who are funded through the Arts Council to support the workforce to better engage young children through music. 2 Musicians will be working with our Early Years 2 Team at some point next year.





It is these new connections and our engagement in research that helps to keep our service up to date. The teams are constantly on the lookout for new learning to inform and develop our provision at St Pauls.
